Seed Dispersal Cadence by Ruth Kriteman and Diana Pinkston-Stewart

We just know what we've been told, Seed dispersal's as good as gold. When seeds are moved they get a chance, To grow again into strong new plants.

Sound off – seeds move, Sound off - distribution, Sound off – 1-2-3-4. Seed Dispersal!

Some seeds soar and fly on the wind, They're light as a feather and float and spin. Others bob on the water like a boat, Down the river and to the beach they float.

Sound off - coconuts, Sound off - water lilies, Sound off - 1-2-3-4. Aquatic plants!

Other seeds hitchhike for a ride, They stick to dog's fur and there they hide. Once the dog decides to roll around, The seed falls off and settles in the ground.

Sound off - cockleburs, Sound off - goat's heads, Sounds off-1-2-3-4. Stickiness!

Some plants launch their seeds like a bomb, They explode from the plant and wait for the calm. Then rain and sun and air help it form, First the roots, then the stem, a new plant is born! Sound off – violets, Sound off – papaya, Sound off – 1-2-3-4. Boom!
